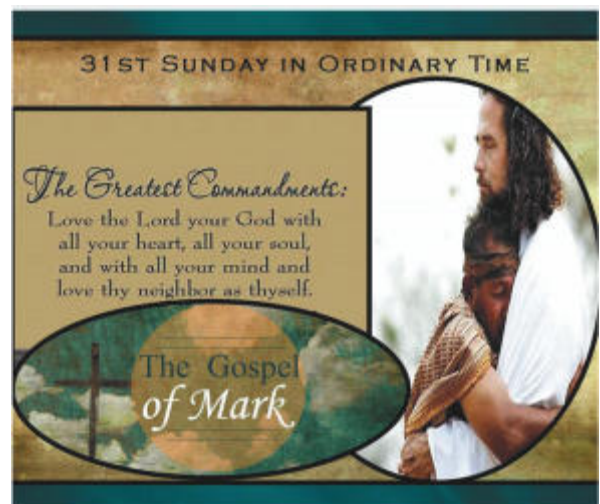

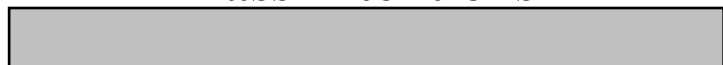

ALL SAINTS

November 1st is the feast of All Saints. During this month, there will be biography of a saint per week. This week it will be the life of St. Maximilian Kolbe.

St. Maximilian was born in Poland on January 7, 1894 to Julius and Maria Kolbe. He is the second of four children. The family practiced their faith and daily said the angelus and the rosary. As a child, Maximilian whose baptismal name was Raymond was somewhat mischievous and at one point upset his mother who stated what will become of you. Her words and obvious

distress brought a radical change in him. At church while he was praying to the Blessed Mother, she appeared to him. The Blessed Mother had two crowns – one was red which stood for martyrdom and the other white which stood for purity. She asked him which one he wanted and he stated both.

Maximilian was a highly intelligent child. Desiring to be an altar boy, he studied Latin and was tutored by a local pharmacist in math and science. Eventually, he went to the seminary, and studied to be a priest receiving doctorate in theology. Father Kolbe founded the Immaculate Movement and spread it through a magazine "The Knight of the Immaculate". He aided in forming a community of 800 Franciscan men.

Father Kolbe went to Japan where he helped build a monastery and India where he furthered the Immaculate movement. However, his health was unstable and he returned to Poland. In 1939, the Nazis invaded Poland. They arrested him but released him. However, in 1941 he was arrested again and sent to Auschwitz, a concentration camp. There he suffered greatly, by being fed very little and forced to perform physical labor that drained his health. On July 31, 1941 in reprisal for an escaped prisoner, ten men were chosen to die by the Nazis. One prisoner, Francis Gajowniczek, was mumbling that he had a wife and children to support and who would take care of them. At this point Father Kolbe volunteered to take his place. The Nazi agreed and placed him and the nine other prisoners into the "starvation bunker" and was placed in cell 18 where he suffered greatly as they were not given food or water. After two weeks, Father Kolbe had not passed away, the Nazis had the doctor give him carbolic acid. His death occurred almost immediately. He died on August 14, 1941. His remains were cremated the next day.

After the road to canonization was completed, Pope John Paul II declared him a saint on October 10, 1982. His feast day is October 14.
